A soldier in the IDF with no family in Israel to support him or her, a new immigrant, a volunteer from abroad, an orphan or an individual from an unsafe home



Who Are The Lone Soldiers?



5.8K Lone Soldiers in the IDF



3% of regular forces are Lone Soldiers (IDF regular forces ~180,000)



40% of Lone Soldiers joined combat units




50% of Lone Soldiers are orphans or individuals from low socio-economic backgrounds



30% of lone soldiers are women

IDF Lone Soldiers come from over 70 countries





IDF Soldier Salary (Per Month)

Regular Soldier



Non-Combat 1,170 shekels (\$304)

Combat 1,620 shekels (\$421)



Non-Combat 1,300 shekels (\$340)

LONE Soldier



Combat 2,500 shekels (\$651)



Additional Food Stipend 120 shekels (\$31)



Possible Rent Assistance 1,000 shekels (\$260)
